

#### How Bala Vihar Works

- Bala Vihar is meant for children ages 4 to 18 years or Pre-Kg to 12th Grade.
- Classes meet on Sundays 10 AM 12:30 PM during the regular school year (Sep. - June).
- Bala Vihar inculcates the values of Sanatana Dharma, a virtuous living, taught by our scriptures.



- The Bala Vihar curriculum includes systematic, age proportionate stories, puzzles, games, bhajans/hymns based on our scriptures including Ramayana, Bhagavatam, Bhagavad Geeta and highlights symbolism in Hinduism & its Cultural practices.
- The classes are conducted by volunteer teachers/sevaks trained in Curriculum.
- Youth Group: High school students
   participate in the Youth Group activities
   including community service that may help
   them for college admission.



### Indian Languages & Other Programs

Language is the Gateway to the Culture and connection to one's roots, i.e., Bharat.

- Telugu, Hindi Tamil, Sanskrit, and Gujarathi languages are offered; additional languages may be offered in future.
- Bilingual curriculum developed locally and resources by Chinmaya Mission West are utilized to teach simple conversation, reading and writing skills.
- Geeta Chanting Competition: Children are taught one chapter of Bhagavad Geeta with meaning each year, so they appreciate its glory since childhood.
- Swaranjali: A music group led by sevaks wherein children learn simple bhajans & songs to express their musical talent and perform during Balavihar programs.

Festival Celebration: Children celebrate major Hindu festivals such as Ganesh Chaturthi, Dasara, Diwali, Sankranti, Holi, Ugadi/Vishu, Gurupournima and learn significance of festivals in Indian culture.
